The Garden-City of Suresnes

At the beginning of the 20th century, a real policy of social housing was introduced in France, with the urban concept of «Garden-Cities» from England. In a context of housing crisis, a solution is sought to disrupt Paris and create a self-sufficient housing

projects on the outskirts of the capital. Henri Sellier, President of the Low-priced Public Housing Office (OPDHBM) of the Seine Department, Minister of Public Health then Mayor of Suresnes, initiated a total of 15 Garden-Cities in the region (Ile-de-France). True utopias, these cities, often implanted in a very green framework, respond to the hygienist preoccupations of his contemporaries. The MUS team regularly organizes guided walking tours of the Garden-City of Suresnes and one of its heritage-apartment from the 1930s. The Garden-City of Suresnes is certified «Heritage of Regional Interest» since July, 2018. For more information, contact them.

The Vineyard of Suresnes

The vineyard of Suresnes is one of the most beautiful vines and the largest of Paris Region! This site, often unknown to the public, is a real attraction to tourists. Located in the heart of the city, the Suresnes vine stretches over one hectare of land, with a view on the Eiffel Tower. The vineyard produces an average of 4,500 bottles per year, which makes the Clos du Pas-Saint-Maurice, the largest vineyard of Paris Region. There are three different cuvées that you will appreciate according to your tastes and menus.

Suresnes American Cemetery

The Cemetery was founded in 1917 by the "Graves Registration Service" and opened in 1919. This place of remembrance covers three hectares. It is the only cemetery in Europe where graves from the two world wars are placed together. An impressive chapel, surrounded by two highly decorated memorial spaces, is dedicated to the memory of the two World Wars.

The perfect alignment of the crosses made of marble from Italy and the splendid natural scenery around create a calm and serene atmosphere.

La Verrière, arts and crafts Gallery

The Arts and Crafts Gallery contributes to preserving the cultural heritage and the recognized expertise of French craftspeople. Designed as a real place of exchanges, it offers 1,000 m² of space dedicated for creation, to protect the unique know-how of craftsmen and the transmission of their jobs.

The Architecture Art Deco is conceived according to the model of the Parisian galleries with glass roof, shop windows, closing grids ...

The Suresnes-Longchamp station

The Suresnes-Longchamp station started its service in 1889, and closed in 1993. It is transformed into a tram station to reopen, with the line, in 1997.

Its passenger building was reassigned; it now hosts the Museum of Urban and Social history (the M.U.S.), which opened in 2013.

The M.U.S - Suresnes History Museum

The Museum of Urban and Social history of Suresnes opened its doors in 2013 in the Suresnes-Longchamp station, which was renovated. Discover its rich and varied collections through permanent and temporary exhibitions, as well as during mediation actions such as conferences or workshops.

The Suresnes Bridge

The bridge connects the Boulogne Forest (Paris) to the city of Suresnes (Hauts-de-Seine department). Historically, the only way to cross the Seine until 1837 was the ferry intended for the passage of pedestrians, horses, carts and carriages. Writings on this subject, dating from the 1590s, indicate its presence.

The remaining testimony is the rue du Bac (Ferry Street), perpendicular to the Seine. In the middle of the 19th century, the industrial period saw the emergence of large factories along the Seine; the landscape drastically changed with the arrival of the railway and the development of the river with the construction of the dam-lock. Four others bridges will follow to connect the two banks.

The Suresnes Dam-Lock

Located along the Gallieni dock, it is made up of three locks and two dams. It measures 185 meters long,

18 meters wide and 5 meters deep. The lock has now 4 passes, each closed by 2 metal valves.

Facts and figures :

- 23 million tons of goods and 7 million passengers per year : traffic denser than the road one.
- 80 boats per day in both directions.

The Open Air School of Suresnes

The Open Air School was based on an idea to improve public health which was endorsed by the mayor at the time, Henri Sellier. The school offers an unusual architecture where the outdoors is always visible. Themes of childhood, medicine, architecture and the town are evoked. If you are inquisitive, the MUS organizes visits.

The Fécheray Terrace

The Mont-Valérien, Eminent Place of the National Memory

From 1941 to 1945, during the Second World War, Mont-Valérien served as a site of execution for more than 1,000 resistance fighters and hostages who were victims of the Nazi occupation. In 1960, President General de Gaulle unveiled the Memorial of the French Resistance (France Combattante) in memory of the heroes and martyrs of the Resistance.

You can discover :

The historical site

- The Clearing was of use by the German army, between 1941 and 1944, for execution of the people sentenced to death and hostages discreetly extracted from prisons and camps of the Paris region,
- The Chapel in which some convicted persons spent their last moments and engraved on the walls their last words.

The place of Memory

- The Memory course overhangs the «clearing of the shot» and allows to follow the way the convicted persons were going to be shot,
- The monument in memory of those executed (Memorial),
- Every year on the 18th of June, a ceremony led by the French President takes place on the esplanade of the memorial to commemorate the Appeal of 18th of June by the General De Gaulle to continue fighting and refusing to admit defeat.

The Fortress of Mont-Valérien and the 8th Signal Corps

The Fortress of Mont-Valérien, one of the sixteen forts built around Paris between 1840 and 1845, overlooks a hill which culminates at 162 meters. It houses institutions, such as the 8th Signal Corps, the Pigeon House of the National Military, the Museum of war Pigeons, and also the museum of Signal Corps which has radio equipment, code details, a transmitter from the Eiffel Tower and military equipment from the World War. It also has the last war Pigeon House in Europe as well as the Museum of War and homing Pigeon.
